Lesson 4

Oh, how wonderful it is, how freeing it is, to realize we do not have to stand in our own power and wisdom, but have access to the power and wisdom of God. As Paul continues to point to the power of God, he reminds us of the benefits available solely to the believer. Rejoice with Paul as you study these awesome truths.

DAYS ONE and TWO: Read 1 Corinthians 2:1-10a

- 1. Read through this week's verses using both your Observation Worksheets and another Bible translation or paraphrase. After reading through these verses, what would you say to someone if they asked you what they were about?
 - a. 1 Corinthians 2:1-10a has been divided into two sections. List below the subject(s) covered in each section.

Verses 1-5

Verses 6-9

Note: We will include verse 10a in next week's lesson.

How would you title each section? Record your titles on the **Chapter & Paragraph Division Titles Chart** provided with your Observation Worksheet.

DAY THREE

- Philip. 3:8-10 Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which *is* from the law, but that which *is* through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith; ¹⁰that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,
- 3a **Philip. 4:13** I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

DAY FOUR
