# 1 Corinthians 14

Lesson 20

In 1 Corinthians 14 Paul continues teaching about the proper use of the gifts, specifically the *gift of tongues* and the *gift of prophesy*. Believers are gifted to minister and to help people, to encourage them in their Christian walk. There are always some people who feel that their gifts and abilities make them better and more favored and privileged than others. This is exactly what happened to the Corinthian church, and it is what has happened to multitudes of believers since that day. Chapter 14 reiterates God's intention for Spiritual gifts and the proper use of them. May your study of this chapter produce in you a hunger for all God has for you.

# DAY ONE: Read 1 Corinthians 14

- 1. Read through this week's verses using both your Observation Worksheets and another Bible translation or paraphrase. After reading through these verses, what would you say to someone if they asked you what they were about?

# DAY TWO: Read 1 Corinthians 14:1-19

- 1. The believers in Corinth freely exercised their gifts (*came short in no gift* 1 Corinthians 1:7) in the church assembly without restraint. Thereby there was much confusion and disorder. In order to remedy this problem, Paul begins his correction with fundamental instructions. Write these from 1 Corinthians 14:1.
- 2. Throughout chapter 14, Paul discusses the spiritual gifts of *tongues* and *prophesy* and their value to the church when used properly. Identify and name which of these gifts Paul is speaking about in the following statements from verses 2-4:

- 3. When a believer speaks in *tongues* he is enabled by the Spirit to pray in an unknown (unlearned) language and is speaking to God. According to 1 Corinthians 14:5,(6-11), 12, and 19 why did Paul encourage the use of *prophesy* over the use of *tongues* in the church? Summarize your answer in your own words.

# DAY FOUR: Read 1 Corinthians 14:26-33a

- 1. Paul again reminds the Corinthians believers of the purpose in exercising spiritual gifts when they gathered. This truth is still relevant today. From the last sentence in 1 Corinthians 14:26 state this purpose.

# DAY FIVE: Read 1 Corinthians 14:33b-40

1. Paul now addresses another problem in the church in Corinth that resulted in chaos instead of the peace God intended for all the churches of the saints (verse 33b). From 1 Corinthians 14:34a,35 record this problem.

Note: The Corinthian church followed the Jewish synagogue pattern by having the men and women separated and seated on either side of the assembly during services.
