Ephesians 6:14a - *Truth*

Lesson 15

We have arrived at the first piece of armor that the believer is to put on to *stand against the wiles of the devil*. The devil is a liar. Therefore, we must fight him, not with his own medicine, but with armor not included in his arsenal – armor that sends him fleeing – armor that leaves us *standing*. Truth. May you discover, as you *gird your waist with truth,* the lies designed to *devour* you to be nothing but feeble attempts. For, *truth* is of our Lord Jesus. Therefore, none can prevail against it.

DAY ONE: Read Ephesians 6:14-19

- 1. This week we will concentrate on Ephesians 6:14a. However, to better understand the context, read Ephesians 6:14-19 using both your Observation Worksheet and another Bible translation or paraphrase. After reading through these verses, what would you say to someone if they asked you what they were about?
- 2. At the right-hand side of the **Chapter & Paragraph Division Titles Chart** are columns labeled **Key Word** and **Symbol**. They have been provided for you to record the key words and the symbol you have chosen to represent each one. Record the key words listed below and their symbols on the chart.

DAY TWO: Read Ephesians 6:14a

1. *Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth...* This is the sixth time Paul mentions the word *truth* in this letter. Look up the other five references and record what they reveal about *truth*:

- 2. According to Ephesians 6:14, what position are we to be in as we *gird our waist with* (put on the belt of) *truth*?
 - a. Think about how hard it is to put on a belt while you are lying down or sitting. What do you think the spiritual significance is of *standing* while you put on *truth*?
 - b. To *stand* is to maintain one's ground. Believers can *stand* against satan, but can unbelievers *stand* against God? Use Psalm 1:5 and Psalm 76:7 to answer this question.

DAY THREE: What is Truth?

- 1. Pilate asked Jesus, *What is truth*? (John 18:38). What did Jesus say about Himself in the previous verse that provoked this question?
 - a. *Truth* was standing right in front of Pilate. What does John 14:6 say to confirm this?
- 2. Rather than tell us to *put on truth,* Paul tells us to put on something (someone) else in Romans 13:14. What did he say?
 - a. What do you think it means to *Put on the Lord Jesus Christ*?
- 3. In what ways is Jesus *truth*?

4. God the Father is also *Truth*. Record what the following verses say about Him regarding *truth*. Deuteronomy 32:4

 The Holy Spirit is also *truth*. Record what the following verses say about Him regarding *truth*. John 15:26

 - b. What did Eve do? See Genesis 3:6.
 - c. If Eve would have *girded her waist with truth,* what would she have done to respond to satan's lie?
 - d. Summarize satan's tactics as they apply to our lives today and how we can fall prey to them, just as Eve did.

- 3. What are satan's intentions for Christians according to 1 Peter 5:8?
 - a. How can believing his *lies devour* us?
 - b. What are some of the *lies* satan tells Christians?
- 4. Read Psalm 77:7-9. Record the Psalmist's six doubts (two in each verse) about God in the left hand column of the chart.
