FIRST DAY: Review and Overview

3.	Note something you learned from Chapter Two about the following:

FIFTH DAY: I Peter 4

1.	I Peter 4 is a powerful chapter that both challenges and encourages believers on how we are to live until our Lord returns. Observe this as you review its content. Choose a phrase or verse that particularly speaks to you from the following paragraphs:
	a. I Peter 4:1-6
	b. I Peter 4:7-11
	c. I Peter 4:12-19
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2.	Read the following instructions from I Peter 4 and give a practical application of each: a. live the rest of his time to the will of God
	b. be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer
	a that in all things Cod may be glowified through Logue Christ
	c. that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ
	d. commit the keeping of their souls to Him as unto a faithful Creator
3.	Once again the subject of <i>suffering</i> is dealt with in I Peter 4. Record one of Peter's statements or an insight you receive concerning <i>suffering</i> from these verses.
