

JOHN 9 - Read through the chapter and summarize each paragraph division

- Chapter 8 closes with Jews taking up stones to cast at Jesus. *But Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple, going through the midst of them, and so passed by* (John 8:59). John 9 continues the events of chapter 8 with the words, *Now as Jesus passed by...* Who did He see?
- John 9:8-12 records the interaction between the man given sight and his neighbors. At this point, the man knows little about the One Who gave him sight. Who did he tell the neighbors healed him? (verse 11)
- The fact that the man's eyes were opened did not seem to be important to the Pharisees. Rather, what seemed to be their concern? (verse 16)
- In John 9:11, the *man who was blind* simply declared his healer to be a *Man called Jesus*. What does he further declare about Jesus in verses 17 and 33?
 - What convinced the *man who was blind* that Jesus was *from God*? (verses 32,33)
