- 1. When Lazarus became ill, Mary and Martha sent word to Jesus. As stated in John 10:40, Jesus was in an area just beyond the Jordan, probably about a day's journey from Lazarus' home in Bethany. What word did John use in John 11:3 to describe Jesus' relationship toward Lazarus?
- 2. In John 9, the reason for the man's blindness was so the *works of God should be revealed in him.* Record from John 11:4 the reason for Lazarus' sickness.
 - a. Unlike man, God works from an eternal perspective. How would having an eternal perspective affect your attitude when you are experiencing a trial?

3. *Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus* (verse 5). Since it was stated twice that Jesus *loved Lazarus*, one would think that Jesus would quickly gather up his disciples and immediately head toward Bethany. Yet, to the contrary, what does John 11:6 say He did?

- a. Jesus did not initially respond as those who loved Lazarus wanted Him to. When do you tend to second-guess God?
- 4. Consider John 11:20-22. What are some things that you *know* about God that you can remind yourself of in times of disappointment and hurt?

5. John 11:25,26 contain one of the most powerful questions of all the ages; the answer to which determines a man's destiny. What is the claim that Jesus made and the question He challenged Martha with?

- 6. Jesus concluded His prayer to the Father. Then *with a loud voice,* what did Jesus say? (John 11:43).
 - a. What did Lazarus do? (verse 44)
- 7. In what way has Jesus *raised you from the dead*?
- 8. **So what!** In what ways has John 11 spoken to you about trusting God and what are you going to do about it?
