

Teachings of the Teacher - A study in the parables of Jesus The Wicked Vinedressers

Matthew 21:33-46

Lesson 19

The parable of the wicked vinedressers is Jesus' response to the chief priests and elders' challenge of Jesus' authority. They were the keepers of God's Word and yet did not believe His servants nor His Son. Thus they stumbled over Him and would one day be crushed by Him. Although we, as believers, have not rejected His Son, may our lives be lived in a way that, when He comes, we will have *fruit to render to Him*.

OBSERVATION: Read Matthew 21:33-46

- 1. Read through this week's verses using both your Observation Worksheet (the last page of this homework) and another Bible translation or paraphrase. After reading through these verses, what would you say to someone if they asked you what they were about?
- 2. Key words help us to better understand a parable. We have listed below key words of this parable. Mark each one in a distinctive way (either with a symbol, highlighting, or some form of boxing, circling, or underlining). Mark each of the key words each time they are used in the text.
 - Key Words: words that refer to *Jesus, God* (Lord), the *landowner*, the *vinedressers*, the *servants*, the *son*, and the *chief priests/Pharisees* stone and the phrase *kingdom of God*

	Jesus expressed the point of the parable in verse 32. John the Baptist had come before Jesus in the way of righteousness. The perceived sinners believed him; the perceived righteous did not believe him. Their rejection of John was actually a rejection of the Father who had sent him. But God is gracious, and instead of sending judgment, He sent His Son. This leads to the second parable, the parable of the wicked vinedressers.



"Hear another parable: There was a certain landowner who planted a vineyard and set a hedge around it, dug a winepress in it and built a tower. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country. ³⁴Now when vintage-time drew near, he sent his servants to the vinedressers, that they might receive its fruit. vinedressers took his servants, beat one, killed one, and stoned another. ³⁶Again he sent other servants, more than the first, and they did likewise to them. ³⁷Then last of all he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' 38But when the vinedressers saw the son, they said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and seize his inheritance.' 39So they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. ⁴⁰Therefore, when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those vinedressers?" 41They said to Him, "He will destroy those wicked men miserably, and lease his vineyard to other vinedressers who will render to him the fruits in their seasons." 42Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'? 43"Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a nation bearing the fruits of it. 44And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder." ⁴⁵Now when the chief priests and Pharisees heard His parables, they perceived that He was speaking of them. ⁴⁶But when they sought to lay hands on Him, they feared the multitudes, because they took Him for a prophet.
