

SEEKING THE LORD

Lesson 16

Paul exhorted us in Philippians to follow his example. Paul was a seeker of Jesus. We would greatly benefit by following Paul's example. Throughout Scripture (over 300 times), God calls us to *seek* Him. In this lesson, we will park on the word *seek* as we reflect on just some of the verses that contain this word. May we be found as Paul found Timothy, a man who *sought the things which are of Christ Jesus*.

Ti	ne Building and Dedication of the Temple
	Although the Lord chose King Solomon, King David's son, to build the temple, David's heart for this work was for God's glory. The verses below relate to David's instructions for the temple and for his son Solomon's reign as king. Read and record the following verses, underlining the word <i>seek</i> .

Challenge: Sadly, Solomon did not follow his own advice and began *seeking* elsewhere. Scan the book of Ecclesiastes and record his lament for seeking pleasure outside of God's will for him.

David, The Seeker of God

1. King David is known as the man after God's own heart. The word *seek* is used thirty-nine times in the Psalms, mostly penned by David. Read and underline the word *seek* in the following Psalms.

Psalm 9:10 And those who know Your name will put their trust in You; for You, LORD, have not forsaken those who seek You.

Psalm 27:4 One thing I have desired of the LORD, that will I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD, and to inquire in His temple.

Psalm 27:8 When You said, "Seek My face," My heart said to You, "Your face, LORD, I will seek."

Psalm 34:10 The young lions lack and suffer hunger; but those who seek the LORD shall not lack any good thing.

Psalm 63:1 O God, You are my God; early will I seek You; my soul thirsts for You; my flesh longs for You in a dry and thirsty land where is no water.

Psalm 105:4 Seek the LORD and His strength; seek His face evermore!
